Activists gather to commemorate Sukkot and support “the mansion tax”

Last Sunday, L.A. City PPC activists joined Clergy & Laity United for Economic Justice (CLUE) and the Faith Caucus of [Yes on Measure ULA](#) to commemorate the Jewish High Holiday of [Sukkot](#). California PPC is an endorser of Measure ULA, also known as the mansion tax: a citizen-led measure that would reduce homelessness, increase affordable housing and protect renters.

Jacqueline Johnson from Alexandria House helped carry out the Sukkot tradition of shaking the lulav to send a blessing to all of creation. Pastor Eddie Anderson spoke to the group about the significance of this effort, reminding us that “everybody has a right to live!” and that it is our collective obligation to fight so that every Angeleno has a place to call home.
