California PPC gets out the vote!

The Northeast San Fernando Valley PPC region gathered at Pacoima Charter School for a potluck this past Saturday to discuss voting and the importance of casting their votes in the upcoming elections. "We shared our origin stories, the experiences that make us doubt the electoral system and the reasons we have to make it work for us," said Irene Montantes, community leader and California Coordinating Committee member. She continued, "Everyone was in agreement that as impacted communities, we must use all forms of our 'voice,' from a spiritual way: to protest on the streets, to nonviolent civil disobedience, to organizing community, to pushing policies and laws to uplift our community, to voting!"
