
- 1. Abolishing poverty as the fourth leading cause of death in the U.S.

Hospitality workers win two more contracts

Unite HERE Local 11 is celebrating agreements reached with two more hotels—Fairfield Inn and Aloft LAX—on fair living wages. The union shared the news on [social media](#):

“Congratulations to the workers from the Fairfield Inn and Aloft LAX for having stood strong and winning a great new contract! Felicidades a los trabajadores del Fairfield Inn y Aloft LAX por haber sido fuertes y ganar un gran contrato nuevo!”

Workers have now reached deals with almost three dozen hotels since they began striking last July. The new contracts guarantee higher pay and other benefits to thousands of housekeepers, cooks, dishwashers, servers and front-desk workers.

“An essential watch for everyone”

The May 24 episode of [Good Faith Weekly](#), a podcast at the intersection of faith and culture, interviewed Stephen Ujlaki, director and producer of *Bad Faith*, and Anne Nelson, an author and a consultant on the documentary.

Sharing his early exploration that became the basis of the film, Ujlaki says, “I wanted to get outside my bubble, and get to know evangelicals to understand how Trump won the election in 2016. I began to interview a number of progressive evangelicals, who were attempting to make sense of the split that was occurring in their religion. This took me to the whole history of the last 40 to 50 years and the story that unfolds in *Bad Faith*—the

business deals, the corruption, the conspiracies, everything that caused us to be living in today's world."
